Maths Addition

Can I use objects to add numbers up to 20 together (Early Learning Goal - Number)

Using objects (toys, pieces of pasta etc.) can you answer an addition sum? For example $12 + 3 =$. How about $16 + ? = 20$.

Feeling super clever?

Can you hold a number in your head and then count on to find the answer to the addition question.

Symmetry

Can I talk about patterns I see? (Early Learning Goal – Shape, space and measure)

Paint one half of a butterfly and fold the wings together? What happens? What do you notice? Can you draw/ paint/ make something else that is symmetrical on both sides?

Feeling super clever?

Can you use a mirror to investigate lines of symmetry? What can you see in the mirror?

Literacy Reading

Can I use my sounds to independently read one of my books?

(Early Learning Goal, Reading)

Log in to your Bug Club Account and complete 1 new book, answering the comprehension questions there.

Writing

Can I use my sounds to independently write a sentence? (Early Learning Goal, Writing)

Can you write an explanation about what happens at each stage of the life cycle of a caterpillar? You can write this under your pictures or as a list.

REMEMBER – When writing we would like you to have a go at writing all the words. Use your sounds to help you. We are not expecting words to be spelt correctly. 1. The crisalis hangs from the leaf. Also, when writing please can you encourage your child to write on lines.

Feeling super clever?

Can you include a full stop for the end of your sentences and a capital letter to start them? Can you write your own version of the story using the days of the week?

Phonics

Please practice saying and writing all of the sounds stuck in your Reading Records. If your grown up gives you a few words with these sounds in, maybe you can use your Fred Fingers to sound them out and write them.

Other Activity Ideas

Can you draw the life cycle of a caterpillar? What other animals life cycles can you draw?


Thinking about the year you were born, what has changed since then? Now talk with your grown ups about the year they were born. What has changed since then? What has stayed the same? What about since the year your grandparents were born? Maybe you could use the internet to look at some news and events from these years.

Can you spot any butterflies when you are out walking?

Can you use the internet to research a type of butterfly? What one is your favourite and why?

Can you retell the story without the pictures of prompts? If you were the author, how would you change the story? What foods would you eat?

Maybe you could write down what you ate on each day of the week.



Write some tricky words that you need to practice (words you cannot sound out) and see if you can read them. You could use a paper aeroplane and throw it at the words, say the one it lands on.
