Maths — Measures

Can I measure mass (weight) in grams and kilograms?

- **Can I read scales in g and kg?**

Children need to be able to read scales in grams or in kilograms to the nearest kg

- Practice weighing in grams or kilograms and reading the scale (children need to be able to read a scale rather than using digital scales)
- Try baking a familiar recipe or helping with the cooking

- Try the activity pages we have put on Dojo

Fluency (non-computer)

- Revise and recall number bonds to 100 e.g. 80+20, 70+30 etc.

How quickly can these facts be recalled?

Extension Challenge

- Begin to learn multiplication facts for the 10 times table. How quickly can these number facts be recalled?
