

Home Learning Grid – Early Years – Week beginning 18th May 2020

Our learning this week is based around the book *Bear's Pack* by Sarah Crossley (Mrs Thomas has videoed herself reading this). Please upload any home learning to Tapestry.

Maths Subtraction

Can I use a number story to talk about subtraction (Early Learning Goal - Number)

Can you use a number story to talk about subtraction. For example in my rucksack I have 3 books, I gave 2 books away so I have 1 book left. Can you write the subtraction calculation that goes with this? $3-2=1$.

Feeling super clever?

Could you make up a number story for numbers above 10? In my rucksack I had 15 gems I gave 10 away so now I have 5 gems left. $15-10=5$.

Weight

Can I order three items by weight and use mathematical language to talk about weight? (Early Learning Goal – Shape, space and measure)

Can you hold three items in your hand and work out which one is the heaviest and which one is the lightest? Is this item that is the heaviest/ lightest also the biggest/ smallest? Are all small items light and big items heavy?

Feeling super clever?

Using scales can you look at the numbers? What happens to the number when you put a heavy item on the scales. What happens when you put a light item on the scales? Can you use this understanding to order three items?

Literacy Reading

Can I use my sounds to independently read one of my books?

(Early Learning Goal, Reading)

Log in to your Bug Club Account and complete 1 new book, answering the comprehension questions there.

Writing

Can I use my sounds to independently write a sentence? (Early Learning Goal, Writing)

If you were going on an adventure or a long walk what would you pack in your rucksack and why?

REMEMBER – when writing we would like you to have a go at writing all the words. Use your sounds to help you. We are not expecting words to be spelt correctly. I wood pack a tent beecoz it might get dark.. Is a perfectly good sentence as the child has written the sounds they can hear using the sounds they have learnt.

Also, when writing please can you encouraged your child to write on lines.

Feeling super clever?

Maybe you could write more than one sentence.

Phonics

Please practice saying and writing all of the sounds stuck in your Reading Records. If your grown up gives you a few words with these sounds in, maybe you can use your Fred Fingers to sound them out and write them.

Other Activity Ideas

This book was written by someone from Canada. Could you choose another country around the world and do some research on it. Maybe this could be somewhere you have been on holiday.

- **Where is this place?**
- **What animals live there?**
- **What is the weather like there?**
- **How would you get there (boat/ plane)**
- **What are the similarities and differences between this place and the UK?**

Could you help your grown up to do some cooking or baking?
